Bus Rules

- 1—Follow all directions by the driver.

- 6—Inappropriate language is not permitted on the bus.
- 7—Intentional damage to the bus may result in immediate or permanent removal from the bus.
- 8—Keep all body parts inside the bus at all times.
- 9—Fighting on the bus or at the bus stop may result in loss of bus riding privileges.
- 10—Do not throw anything on the bus or out of the bus while riding.
- 11—Sit in your assigned seat and face the front.

Elementary School Supply Lists

OHSAA Bylaws for Students in Grades 7-12

Please familiarize yourself with the following OHSAA Bylaws:

- All beginning seventh graders are eligible insofar as the scholarship bylaw.
- All beginning ninth graders must have passed 75 percent of subjects in which enrolled the immediately preceding grading period.
- Eligibility for each grading period is determined by grades received the preceding grading period. **Semester and yearly grades have no effect on OHSAA eligibility.**
- Grades 9-12: To be eligible, a student-athlete must be currently enrolled in a member school and have received passing grades in a minimum of five one-credit courses, or the equivalent, in the immediately preceding grading period (Note: Students taking post-secondary options must comply with these standards).
- Grades 7-8: To be eligible, a student-athlete must be currently enrolled in a member school and have received passing grades in 75 percent of subjects in which enrolled the immediately preceding grading period.
- For eligibility, summer school grades may not be used to substitute for failing grades received in the final grading period of the regular school year or for lack of enough courses taken the preceding grading period.

Examples of Determining Student Eligibility – Grades 9-12

Passing grades must have been received in a minimum of five one-credit courses, or the equivalent, in the immediately preceding grading period.

To determine credit equivalency, multiply full-year courses by a factor of 1; semester courses by a factor of 2; twelve-week courses by a factor of 3; and nine-week courses by a factor of 4.

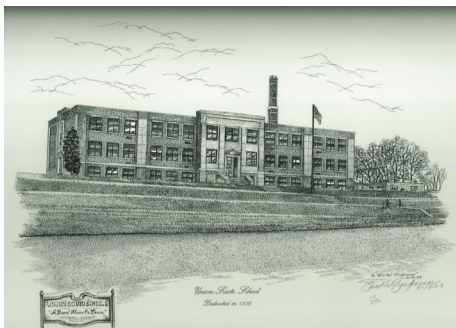

Unioto History

In May of 1937, the Unioto High School graduated its first senior class of 8 members. Today, Unioto High school graduates close to 150 students in a class. Our record of excellence draws students from all areas of the county.

The one room school houses of Union and Scioto townships were abandoned at the end of the school year 1935-1936, upon the recommendation of the State Department of Education. A new district was created using the name Union-Scioto Rural School. The school became known as "Unioto", a contractive term taken from Union and Scioto. A tax levy of 3½ mills voted by the district evolved the sum of \$50,000 which was matched by another \$50,000 from the Federal government under the Public Works Administration and numbered as Project M OH 1021 R. The building site was purchased from Mr. George Garrison, on Egypt Pike, for the sum of \$2,000. Construction was started in February of 1936, and the building was occupied September 23 of the same year. DeVoss and Donaldson were the architects, McCabe and Proctor were the contractors.

It was thought that the colors of purple and gold were adopted at the suggestion of one of the board members whose Chillicothe class colors were purple and gold. The mascot name of "The Shermans" was later adopted when Superintendent McMahon, former general in the United States Army, was superintendent for the Unioto School. Since Unioto lies just opposite the former site of WWI Camp Sherman, the suggestion of "The Shermans" was unanimously accepted by the student body. The "Tank" emblem became likewise a fitting symbol for the school.
